The story starts off talking about several of the characters like a little girl named Emma who lives in Vermont, Oliver, an octopus, who only wants to explore the ocean and Steve, a shy starfish, who is teased at school.

Emma's father was rewarded from his boss with a vacation to St. Thomas, and for Emma it was a dream come true! Emma's favorite stuffed animal is an octopus and really hopes to see one when they take a ride on a glass bottom boat.
